Easily accessed from Rt. 6, many sporting recreational activities are continued to be practiced at the club's 350 acre facility. The responsible and safe use of firearms for shooting sports, hunting, defense and the ethical stewardship of our natural resources is at our core, and we welcome those that hold the similar heritage and values. In addition to the comradery among it's over 500 members, the contributions made to the community, various charities donations and scholarship offerings, law enforcement, and the promotion of the shooting sports for future generations makes FSC the premier sportsmen's club in the area.

FSC offers shotgun (trap, 5 stand, skeet, & sporting clays), rifle (CMP, NRA Silhouette, Rimfire & Long Range sporting events), pistol (Steel Challenge & USPSA), Muzzleloader and an Archery 3-D course and tower. Other scheduled activities include Horseshoes, Darts, Hunter / Trapper Education classes, Adopt a Highway, various firearm & range officer Certifications, Youth activities, along with many other special shooting events and fundraisers though out the year.

Steel Challenge – **Barry Ruane** – we had 32 entries previous match.

Trap - **Ned Tyler** - Had 144 rounds in Sept, 105 by members. 39 by non-members. Season is now ended.YEAR END TOTALS: shot 20 times during the season with 633 rounds, 521 by members, 112 by non members. This was my last season as event chairperson.

U.S.P.S.A – **Barry Ruane** – we had 33 entries previous match, the day after the flooding. Drainage on the pistol pits was outstanding. 2nd Sunday of the Month, setup and registration at 9:00, match begins at 10:00
